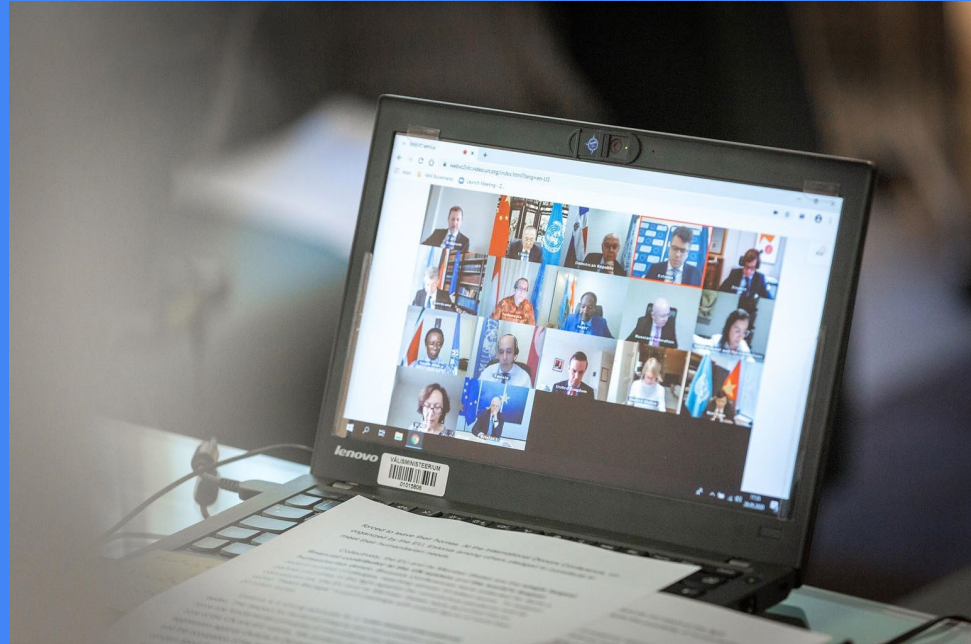

City's allocation:
\$2,795,087

HOME-American Rescue Plan (ARP):

- ❖ Signed into law in March 2021
- ❖ Provides over \$1.9 trillion in relief to address the continued impact of the COVID-19 pandemic
- ❖ \$5 billion in HOME-ARP funds was appropriated by Congress to address the need of homelessness assistance and supportive services

Eligible Activities for HOME-ARP Funds

1. Development and support of affordable rental housing;
2. Tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA);
3. Provision of supportive services;
4. Acquisition and development of non-congregate shelter units; and
5. Administration and planning costs

Qualifying Populations

Individuals or families that are:

1. Homeless;
2. At risk of homelessness;
3. Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking or human trafficking;
4. Part of other populations where providing supportive services or assistance would prevent a family's homelessness or would serve those with the greatest risk of housing instability; and
5. Veterans and families that include a veteran family member that meet the criteria in one of (1) - (4) above.
