SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE CITY OF NEWPORT NEWS

FY 2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Newport News is conducting a virtual public hearing on Wednesday July 28, 2021 at 3:00 p.m. to gather comments and input on the substantial amendment to the City's Annual Action Plan for the Community Development Block Grant Program for Fiscal 2020-21 for Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) funding.

The City of Newport News, Virginia was allocated \$769,836 in Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funding from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) for round one funding and \$971,659 for round 3 funding for a total of \$1,741,495. These funds must be used to prevent, prepare for or respond to the spread of COVID-19 and its economic impacts. The Amended 2020 Annual Action Plan will serve as a grant application for the CDBG-CV funds made available through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) from the CARES Act.
